

Piecing it Together

WHAT: A technique to clustering ideas or data.

WHY: To invite people to engage with content in a personal way; to shed light on the diversity of viewpoints on any given content.

HOW: Invite participants to group or sequence content, events, data or ideas. This is usually a solo or small group activity; if it is done in small groups the dialogue is important as they come to agreement about where bits of information should or shouldn't be. After everyone is finished, you can use the "gallery walk" technique to see what everyone has accomplished. The debrief of the work is critical for meaning making and can be done standing if everyone has been moving around the room; the debrief can help surface questions, clarify misunderstandings and highlight priorities.

WHEN: As part of a warm-up at the start of a day or important work with a group.
